

**RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLLEGE PARK
SUPPORTING THE METROPOLITAN WASHINGTON COUNCIL OF
GOVERNMENTS AND THE DMVMOVES INITIATIVE**

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (COG) and the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) have jointly developed DMVMoves, a regional initiative aimed at creating a unified vision and sustainable long-term funding model for the metropolitan Washington transit network; and

WHEREAS, DMVMoves was established to address the region's ongoing transit needs by strengthening coordination among transit operators, modernizing critical infrastructure, and ensuring reliable, efficient, and equitable mobility options for residents across the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia; and

WHEREAS, in November 2025, following 18 months of regional collaboration, the COG and WMATA Boards jointly endorsed a set of recommendations from the DMVMoves Task Force, including support for new annual capital funding to modernize Metro and enhancements to transit integration across the region; and

WHEREAS, robust and sustainable public transit is essential to the economic vitality, environmental sustainability, and overall quality of life in our region, benefiting residents, businesses, commuters, visitors, and future generations; and


WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of College Park recognize the importance of regional cooperation in addressing systemwide transit needs and acknowledge the significant role that DMVMoves plays in promoting a comprehensive, forward-looking transportation vision.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the City of College Park hereby express their support for the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments and the DMVMoves initiative; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of College Park commits to continued collaboration with regional partners to advance coordinated transit planning, sustainable funding solutions, and integrated mobility improvements that strengthen our shared metropolitan region.
