RESOLUTION 2026-8

**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE ENDORSEMENT
OF THE DMVMOVES PLAN AND FUNDING PROPOSAL**

WHEREAS, the City of Takoma Park is committed to advancing sustainable transportation, regional mobility, and economic growth for its residents and the broader metropolitan area; and

WHEREAS, City of Takoma Park's residents use the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) Takoma and Fort Totten Metro stations and will be able to access two future Purple Line stations, Takoma-Langley and Long Branch, providing residents and visitors with expanded access to regional transit networks; and

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (COG) has launched the DMVMoves initiative to strengthen collaboration among the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia to improve transportation networks, reduce congestion, and promote equitable access to transit; and

WHEREAS, the COG and WMATA Boards of Directors appointed the DMVMoves Task Force of regional officials to lead the DMVMoves effort and to develop a shared vision for the future of the region's transit network and identify sustainable, long-term, dedicated funding sources to support it; and

WHEREAS, the culmination of this collaboration is the DMVMoves Plan, which outlines both a funding recommendation to address WMATA's long-term capital needs and a Regional Transit Integration Action Plan that calls for coordinated investments and actions to make travel across the region faster, safer, more integrated, and more reliable; and

WHEREAS, the DMVMoves Plan aligns with Takoma Park's goals to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, enhance transportation options, and support inclusive community development.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of Takoma Park hereby expresses its strong support for COG's DMVMoves Plan and funding proposal and commits to working with regional partners to advance shared transportation priorities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Takoma Park will actively participate in DMVMoves efforts, encourage community engagement, and advocate for resources that benefit our residents and the region as a whole.
